We thank you for the Archbishops' statement on the report of the Anti-Racism task force and we repeat before you their desire and ours for wisdom, courage and grace as the Church moves from lament to action. And in the same way we pray for the United States of America.

You, our Cornerstone, were brought back from the dead as that great Shepherd of the sheep, and you gather all to that peaceful fold where the wolf can't get in.
